### First-Year Seminar

5 hours (2.5 per semester)

Multiple sections: enrollment will close out for each section at 10, and then will re-open again once all have reached 10.

Fall: FYS 191.xx

Spring: FYS 192.xx

*\*Students enrolled in a given section of FYS 191 in the fall of their 1<sup>st</sup> year will automatically be enrolled in the same section for FYS 192 in the spring.*

### Liberal Arts & Sciences

#### Level I — Option 1. Traditional Courses

*Humanities* 6-8

Choose two courses from different disciplines among HIS 101 or 102, Eng 231, and any 100- or 200-level REL or PHI course

*Human Society & Behavior* 6-8

Choose two courses from different disciplines among 100-level courses in SOC, PSY, POL, or ECO

*The Natural World* 6-8

Choose two laboratory courses from different disciplines in AST, BIO, CHE, CNR, EAR, or PHY

*Fine Arts* 3

Choose any 100 or 200-level among ART, DAN, MUS, or THR

#### Level I — Option 2. Sequences 18-21

Year-long thematic courses in HUM, HSB, and NAT (the last must be a laboratory science). Will be available Fall 2011. Look for course numbers 238 and 239.

#### Level II. 6-8

After students have completed their Level I requirement, they select two tailored, single-semester, upper-division (300-level) seminars in HUM, HSB, and NAT. These are capped at 18 students, and include both SEE and WRI components. Course numbers will be assigned at a later date.

- *Liberal Arts Majors must take their Level II seminars in the areas that do not contain their major;*
- *Professional Majors may select any two Level II seminars.*
