### Liberal Arts & Sciences

#### Level I — Option 1. Traditional Courses

*Humanities* 6

Choose two courses from different disciplines among HIS 101 or 102, Eng 231, and any 100- or 200-level REL or PHI course (other than REL 100).

*Human Society & Behavior* 6

Choose two courses from different disciplines among 100-level courses in SOC, PSY, POL, or ECO

*The Natural World* 6-8

Choose two laboratory courses from different disciplines in AST, BIO, CHE, EAR, ENV, PHY, or SCI

*Fine Arts* 3

Choose any 100 or 200-level among ART, DAN, MUS, or THR

#### Level I — Option 2. Sequences 18-21

Year-long thematic courses in HUM, HSB, and NAT (the last must be a laboratory science). These will be multi-section courses numbered 188 for Fall and 189 for Spring.

#### Level II. 6

After students have completed their Level I requirement, they select two tailored, single-semester, upper-division (300-level) seminars in HUM, HSB, and NAT. These will be numbered 388. These are capped at 18 students, and include both SEE and WRI components.

- *Liberal Arts Majors must take their Level II seminars in the areas that do not contain their major;*
- *Professional Majors may select any two Level II seminars.*
