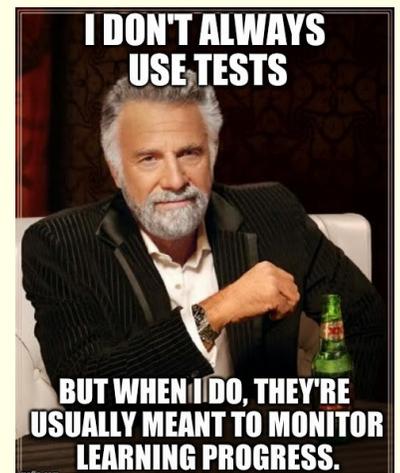

Advising Tips



Early November is advising time! Below are some tips to help make advising more productive for your advisees and more enjoyable for you. Dr. Jenny Bloom offers the following six-step process for effective advising:

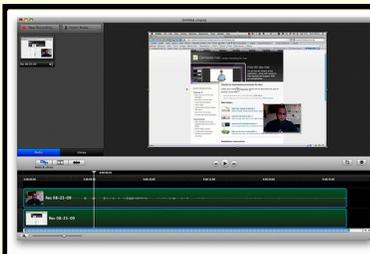

1. Disarm: make the student feel welcome, and create a good rapport.
2. Discover: use positive, open-ended questions to learn about the student.
3. Dream: ask the student about his/her goals for the future.
4. Design: work with the student to create a plan to reach those goals. Scheduling classes is one small part of this design.
5. Deliver: follow the student as he/she implements that plan.
6. Don't settle: keep your own expectations high and encourage the student to do the same.
