In association with the Clemmer-Long Center for Vocation and Purpose, the Vocations in Faith Fellows Program helps students discern a call to service through hands-on engagement, congregational involvement, mentorship and leadership formation.

In partnership with local churches and faith-based nonprofits, fellows gain meaningful experience serving communities while growing in faith, leadership and vocational purpose.

Eight first- and second-year students will be selected for the first cohort.

THE TWO-YEAR FELLOW EXPERIENCE

YEAR ONE *FALL 2026 - SPRING 2027*

- Placement with a local congregation or a nonprofit partner
- Service and ministry engagement throughout the academic year
- Monthly mentorship and leadership formation dinners
- Guided reflection with LR faculty and site supervisors

YEAR TWO *FALL 2027 - SPRING 2028*

- Enrollment in a shared academic experience
- Choice of the Great Books OR Global Studies course
- Continued mentorship and vocational formation

LR faculty will work with internship supervisors to assign the fellows to a local congregation/nonprofit that is aligned with their interests and strengths/skills.
