- Every first-year student who is graduating from high school in 2019 **must** take First-Year Experience in the fall (FYE 191) and in the spring (FYE 192). This is a year-long course designed to help you adjust to college, personally, and academically. Each section of FYE 191-192 will help you develop college-level skills and dispositions, but each section has a different topic.
