### **Cultural Diversity/ Cultural Competence**

This prerequisite should allow the student to demonstrate knowledge and appreciation of the role of sociocultural, socioeconomic, and diversity factors and lifestyle choices in contemporary society.

The Multicultural Perspectives prerequisite course should provide topics that provide the student the opportunity to identify and develop awareness, complexity and sensitivity to the variations and interactions of individuals as influenced by their racial, ethnic, and cultural groupings. Students will need this background knowledge as the OT curriculum expects all OT students to: 1) demonstrate knowledge and understanding of concepts of human behavior including behavioral and social sciences, and 2) demonstrate knowledge and appreciation of the role of sociocultural, socioeconomic, and diversity factors and lifestyle choices in contemporary society.

**Note: Intro Sociology or Intro Anthropology must include the following content in its course description in order to be counted as the multicultural perspectives prerequisite course for the OT program at Lenoir-Rhyne University:**

Demonstrate knowledge and appreciation of the role of sociocultural, socioeconomic, and diversity factors and lifestyle choices in contemporary society.

## Ethics

This prerequisite should allow the student to demonstrate an understanding of the ethical and practical considerations that affect the health and wellness needs of those who are experiencing or are at risk for social injustice, occupational deprivation, and disparity in the receipt of services.

**The Ethics prerequisite course should provide a critical examination of major ethical theories that will provide the student the opportunity to investigate significant ethical dilemmas regarding individuals and society. Students will need this background knowledge as the OT curriculum will expect all OT students to articulate the influence of social conditions and the ethical context in which humans choose and engage in occupations.**
